Investment Weekly

Commentary and Statistics

- Global stocks declined following an incredible start to 2018, with the S&P 500 experiencing its biggest single-day dive since September 2016. Gold and oil also fell. The yield on the 10-year U.S. Treasury note closed at approximately 2.83%.
- With 50% of S&P 500 companies having reported fourth-quarter results, 75% have reported positive earnings per share (EPS) while 80% have beaten sales expectations. According to FactSet, the fourth quarter blended earnings growth estimate for the S&P 500 is 13.4%. As of February 2, 2018, the forward 12-month P/E ratio for the S&P 500 stood at 18.0, above the five-year average of 16.0 and the ten-year average of 14.2. Sprint, Amazon and AT&T impressed this week while Guess?, PayPal and Tractor Supply disappointed.
- Negotiators closed the sixth round of NAFTA renegotiations in Montreal during the week, though they did not choose to issue a joint statement. The next (and supposedly final) round of talks will begin in Mexico City in late February; and while there has been talk about extending them farther, this could prove difficult given Mexico's presidential and congressional elections in July.
- During Janet Yellen's final meeting as chair, the FOMC concluded its January meeting with a 9-0 vote to hold interest rates steady. There were few expectations for a hike at this meeting, given the relatively short distance from December's meeting and the lack of a scheduled press conference or release of economic projections. However, the FOMC statement offered a slight upgrade in the inflation language, noting that market-based inflation measures "have increased in recent months" and that prices are expected to "move up this year."

- Consumer spending increased 0.4% month-to-month in December, slightly below expectations of 0.5%. Personal income was a bright spot, with the print of +0.4% higher than estimates of +0.3%. Despite the miss, the 3.1% year-over-year gain in consumer spending was the largest increase since 2015.
- The core PCE price index rose 0.2% month-to-month in December, in line with expectations, and rising 1.5% year-over-year (missing estimates of +1.6%). Note that core PCE, a key indicator for the Federal Reserve, has been below the Fed's 2% target since 2012.

Index Definitions

Bloomberg Barclays Global Aggregate Bond Index measures a wide range of global government, government-related, corporate and securitized fixed-income investments, all with maturities greater than one year.

Bloomberg Barclays High Yield Bond Index tracks the performance of below investment grade U.S. dollar-denominated corporate bonds publicly issued in the U.S. domestic market.

Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Index is a bond market index composed of U.S. securities in Treasury, Government-Related, Corporate, and Securitized sectors that are of investment-grade quality or better, have at least one year to maturity, and have an outstanding par value of at least \$250 million.

Dow Jones Industrial Average is a price-weighted average computed from the stock prices of 30 of the largest and most widely held public companies in the United States, adjusted to reflect stock splits and stock dividends.

FTSE EPRA/NAREIT Global Real Estate Index represents general performance trends of the equity securities of real estate companies involved in the ownership, disposition and development of income-producing properties worldwide.

JPMorgan Emerging Markets Bond Index Plus (EMBI+) tracks total returns for traded foreign currency denominated debt instruments in the emerging markets which meet minimum criteria for face value outstanding and market trading liquidity.
